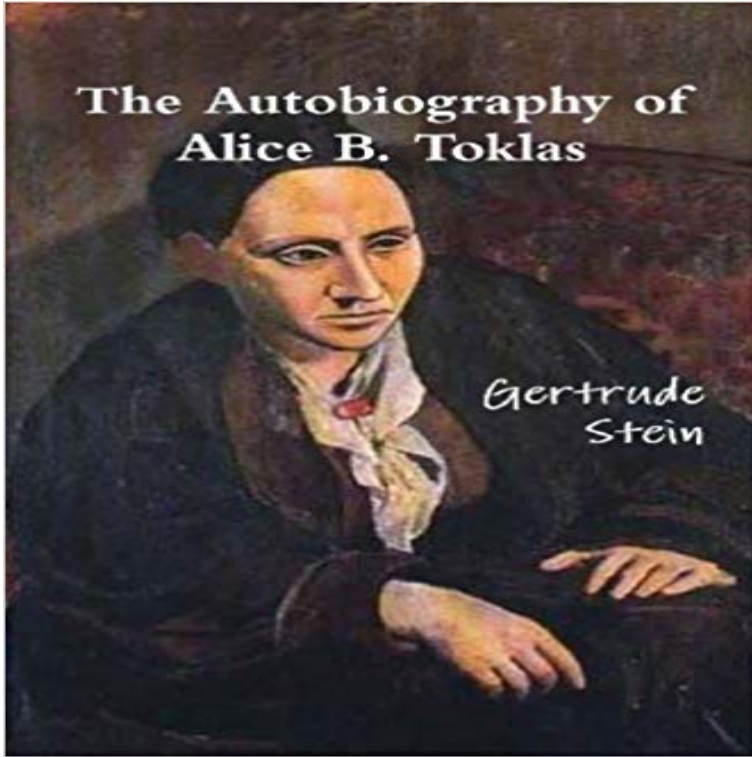


THE BIOGRAPHY OF ALICE B. TOKLAS.
